The City continues to witness an increase in interest in cityowned residential lots. There is currently only 1 residential lot left on 101st street and 1 multi-family lot. Administration continues to explore potential areas that can be serviced and put on the market as soon as possible.

It presented opportunities for networking amongst communities and developers in attendance. JOE DAY - CITY MANAGER

The City of Humboldt is currently accepting RFPs for a Development Levy & Servicing Fee Study. The study is meant to guide the City in finding a balance between attracting new property owners and keeping costs to current property owners as low as possible while preparing for the potential exponential growth in the near future.

Public Works

PETER BERQUIST - DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS

2024 has so far been the busiest year in recent history for the Public Works Department in regards to general city construction, capital construction projects and planning support that the department is contributing to other departments and contractors.

Letters to rural and urban municipalities in the area were sent out requesting to participate in the proposed capital funding model for the Humboldt airport. The final tally of responses will be brought to Council at a later date.

The Wastewater Treatment Facility Project is progressing well. The majority of pipe has been delivered and significant sections fused. There will be a few delays in regards to some of the pipes so there are no conflicts with farming activities. However, things are ahead of schedule for the operations building and in addition, the excavation work can start sooner than originally projected.

Community & Leisure Services

MICHAEL ULRIKSEN - DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY & LEISURE **SERVICES**

Second Ice Surface Stakeholder Engagement: The initial phase of the community consultation included a general community survey. The survey was open to the general public for the first two weeks of April and resulted in 560 responses, including nearly 30% from outside of the City of Humboldt. Administration will be engaging non-profit organizations and businesses in the next phase.

On May 7th and 8th, the Director of Community & Leisure Services attended a recreation conference put on by the SPRA. The conference was focused on innovation in recreation, understanding the economics of recreation and advocating the benefits of recreation for the community.
