Bylaws

Council passed Bylaw 02/2025 which replaces Bylaw 02/2020 (council procedures bylaw) to include the addition of land acknowledgements to be made at City Council meetinas.

Council passed bylaw 03/2025 to replace Bylaw 11/19 (parks and public spaces bylaw) to include a restriction of hours citizens are allowed to be in public parks or spaces as well as organized sports, public meetings or ceremonies, demonstrations or concerts without a city permit.

Public Notice

At the City Council meeting on Feb. 24, 2025, the council will be reviewing the following:

Bylaw 04/2025, a bylaw to amend bylaw 04/2016 - The Zoning Bylaw. The amendment, if approved will rezone Lot 27, Block 58, Plan 102200038 from C2 - Medium Density Commercial District R3 - Core Mixed Residential District.

New Business (cont.)

Aquatic Centre Flooring - Full installation of a rubber-based flooring product will go ahead toward the end of March/ beginning of April. The pool will need to be shut down for four to five days for installation and allowing time for the product to cure. The project is estimated to cost \$132,288 which is lower than initially budgeted for in the 2025 budget.

DID YOU KNOW?

The City of Humboldt is currently seeking proposals from interested groups or private entities to take over, own, or operate the Humboldt airport.

In 2024, the city reached out to 14 RM's and municipalities within a 30 km radius with a shared funding plan and all respondents declined participation.

The deadline for proposals is February 24th after which will be reviewed and presented to City Council for consideration.
