HUMBOLDT'S HISTORY

The City of Humboldt is named after Baron Alexander von Humboldt, a world famous German scientist and naturalist, who traveled extensively in Central and South America. The name "Humboldt" was approved in 1875 for the site in the Northwest Territories along the Canadian Pacific Telegraph Line at which a repair station was built. The station played an integral part in communications for the developing west and in the Métis Resistance of 1885 at Batoche. With the increasing development of western Canada, settlers were arriving in the area at the turn of the century. The history of Humboldt was influenced by the establishment of St. Peter's Colony by the Benedictine monks. The name Humboldt was transferred to the village in 1905 and it became a town in 1907. Humboldt became Saskatchewan's thirteenth city in November 2000.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES IN HUMBOLDT





The City of Humboldt, Humboldt Fire and Rescue, the RCMP and Humboldt Ambulance Services conduct various

safety and preventative educational programs in partnership with "Safe Communities", such as Pedestrian Safety, youth programs, and farm safety. Senior and new comer safety programs are also delivered to residents within the district.

DRONE PROGRAM:

In 2019, Protective Services, Humboldt Ambulance Services, RCMP and the City of Humboldt jointly purchased a "DJI Mavic Drone" to assist as an emergency search and rescue tool, as well as provide a unique perspective for City administration staff on which to base their recommendations to Council in areas such as public works, engineering, marketing and planning.

Each will benefit from the availability of up-to-date, project-specific imagery that can be captured by the drone.

The Humboldt and District Emergency Management Organization ("EMO") works with emergency services and other agencies to ensure Humboldt is ready to respond in the event of a major emergency or disaster





Fire Department

The Humboldt Fire Department has a full time Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief with a volunteer force of over 25 members who proudly protect Humboldt's citizens. The Humboldt Fire Department is committed to serving the community and surrounding communities through excellence in fire prevention, education, community protection, safety programs and services.

Ambulance Service

Humboldt & District Ambulance Service is a privately-owned emergency medical service that provides care to the City of Humboldt & the surrounding area. Their team is comprised of all levels of prehospital providers including Primary Care Paramedics, Intermediate Care Paramedics and Advanced Care Paramedics.

RCMP

Humboldt is an RCMP service centre for the east-central portion of the province and has a Detachment Office that serves both the City of Humboldt as well as the surrounding rural region.

Agriculture, Manufacturing and Mining

Agriculture and manufacturing, have defined and diversified the Humboldt region, developing the region as a service hub.

Addtionally Humboldt and area is rich in natural resources, primarily potash, with Nutrien and BHP mining giants in our backyard successfuly producing products and delivering services to the agriculture industry worldwide.

Manufacturing businesses, such as well-known agriculture manufacturers, Schulte Industries and Bourgault Industries, are within the Humboldt Region.

Additionally, Prairie Agricultural Machinery Institute (PAMI) call Humboldt home.

Saskatchewan is a leading supplier of agricultural products for some of the world's fastest growing countries. With a growing global population demanding high-quality agri-food products, we are an increasingly important food supplier.

Saskatchewan is home to more than 40 per cent of Canada's cultivated farmland with 18.9 million hectares (46.7 million acres). Saskatchewan is Canada's primary growing region for grains, oilseeds and pulses. We also have more than six million hectares of pasture and land dedicated to permanent cover for forage crops. Humboldt is located in the heart of the province and the heart of agriculture.¹

TRANSPORTATION CORRIDOR

Highways 5 & 20 intersect in Humboldt that link with TransCanada Highway 16, and Highway 6.

AIRPORT

The City of Humboldt manages a municipal airport, located approximately two kilometres south of Humboldt on Highway #20. The airport is a base for both private and commercial aircraft operators. The airport occupies approximately 73 acres and contains an aviation gasoline refueling tank, an apron area, a joining taxiway system and two runways.
