TREES AND HEDGES

Homeowners are responsible for making sure that trees, hedges, and shrubs on their property don't interfere with pedestrians using the sidewalk or vehicles on the street or alley.

Please take a moment to speak with your neighbours before trimming trees or branches near or overhanging your property line. The City of Humboldt doesn't mediate private tree disputes. More often than not, lack of communication tends to be the "root" of the problem!

BACK ALLEYS

In Humboldt, alleys are shared neighbourhood spaces. That means property owners maintain the alley right-of-way behind their house. Maintenance includes keeping weeds mowed, trees, bushes, vegetation and shrubs trimmed, and litter picked up.

Taking pride in the appearance of your back alley shows you care and encourages your neighbours to do the same. Keeping your alley free from overgrown grass, weeds, unwanted trees and junk isn't just for looks. You're helping to keep your neighbourhood safe, too!

TALL GRASS AND WEEDS

Controlling your grass and weeds is one of the simplest ways to be a good neighbour. Property owners, including those with vacant lots, are responsible for keeping grass and weeds in check.

Your relationship with your neighbours can be affected by how your home looks outside. Additionally, by keeping your home tidy, it could enhance the value of your property.

RESPONSIBLE PET OWNERSHIP

As a responsible pet owner, you're expected to keep your pets from negatively affecting other people, animals and the environment. This includes proper waste disposal, noise control, and not allowing your pets to stray.

When you take your pet off your property, you are entering a public shared space. Remember to keep your pet on a leash and clean up after your pet.

Picking up after your pet is part of responsible ownership. Whether it's on your private property or in public, immediately dispose of your pet's waste. Allowing pet waste to accumulate on your property to the point where it is reasonably likely to annoy or pose a health risk to others is not a neighbourly thing to do.

Humboldt is a great city filled with close-knit and thriving neighbourhoods. These neighbourhoods are great places to live because of the people who live there. So, what makes a good neighbour? A good neighbour builds friendly, trusting and respectful relationships with those around them.
