SPRING MELT: With spring melt underway, catch basins are needing to be re-thawed at times as the nighttime temperatures are still quite cold. Staff are monitoring the forecast and assigning staff to the thawing machines as necessary. In addition to thawing catch basins, staff have been staying on top of the drainage channels within and outside the City so the water flows freely.

STREET SWEEPING: The street sweeping blitz has begun. Weather holding and the snow continuing to disappear, we will continue the street sweeper operation from 4:00 am to 8:00 pm. This will continue until we have covered the entire City at least once.

The spring street sweeping blitz will proceed in the same order as our snow clearing process:

- Downtown initially then our priority 1 streets
- Priority 2 streets
- Priority 3 streets
- Then our cul-de-sacs and residential streets
