RECONCILIATION THROUGH LIVING HERITAGE

Representatives of Living Heritage Saskatchewan and the Office of the Treaty Commissioner ('OTC') provided Council with a presentation about the "Relationship Building and Reconciliation through Living Heritage Pilot Project" currently underway in Humboldt in collaboration with the Department of Cultural Services will work to develop and deliver programs for the community to learn about Truth and Reconcilation and act on the Calls to Action. Proposed Liquore Store: A new Discretionary Use Application from the same applicant for a proposed liquor store that was approved at the February 27th Council Meeting was reviewed and approved. The previous Discretionary Use Application was to construct and operate a proposed liquor store, at 2435 Westwood Dr. Since the approval, the applicant decided to relocate the construction to the parcel of land adjacent to the original property, which constituted the need for a new application. There were no businesses or residents within close proximity of the property objecting the proposed development. Council approved the application subject to the applicant obtaining a Development Permit and all other relevant permits and licenses from the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority.

Proposed Brewpub/Distillery: A Discretionary Use Application to construct and operate a Brewpub and Distillery at 520-9th Street was reviewed and approved by Council. Distilleries, wineries and breweries are considered a discretionary use within the C1 Zone where the property exists. Council approved the application. There were no businesses or residents within close proximity of the property objecting the proposed development. Council approved the application subject to the applicant obtaining a Development Permit and all other relevant permits and licenses from the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority.

2017-18 Humboldt Broncos Day:

On April 6, 2018, the Humboldt Broncos Junior "A" Hockey Club was involved in a tragic bus collision on their way to a playoff game against the Nipawin Hawks, resulting in the heartbreaking loss of 16 people and will have an everlasting traumatic



effect on the 13 who survived, their families and our community.

Mayor Behiel has proclaimed Thursday, April 6, 2023, as "2017-18 Humboldt Broncos Day" and encourages all citizens to remember and honor those who were affected by the tragedy, and to observe a moment of silence at 4:50 pm, the approximate time the tragedy occurred 5 years ago.

Green Shirt Day: On April 6, 2018, the Humboldt Bronco organization, the Humboldt community and the world experienced unimaginable loss and suffering as a result of the Humboldt Bronco team bus tragedy.



On April 7, 2018, Bronco player
Logan Boulet succumbed to his injuries and upon doing so, his parents, Bernadine and Toby Boulet chose to fulfill Logan's wishes and donate his organs so that six lives could be saved.

This selfless act inspired over 100,000 Canadians to become organ donors in the days and weeks that followed which resulted in the largest number of Canadians to register as organ donors in Canadian history due to one event – one person - which has now become known as the "Logan Boulet Effect".

Mayor Behiel has proclaimed Friday, April 7, 2023 as "Green Shirt Day" in the City of Humboldt to raise awareness of the importance of organ donation and to encourage citizens to "have the kitchen table talk" with their families and to wear green on this day to show your support.


