REMINDER ABOUT FIRE PITS

Fire pits must be constructed from a manufactured, non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement or brick, or from sheet metal which is a minimum 10-gauge thickness (9/64 inch) and designed for use as a fire pit and must be covered by a heavy guage metal screen. Fire pits must be more than 10 feet or 3.1 meters from any property line, building, combustible structures, trees or combustible vegetation.

The area on the ground surrounding the circumference/base of a fire pit, outdoor fire place, or fire receptacle must be at least 16 inches (or 40 cm) and must be kept free of combustible materials or vegetation.
