The mural was designed by Indigenous artist Kevin PeeAce with inspiration from 185 students at our local schools who also painted portions of the mural. The Mural was installed in June 2022. The majority of capital projects for 2023 are complete. Staff are busy estimating costs for 2024 projects for the budget process.

Most notable completed projects include, but are not limited to:

- Concrete & Asphalt Paving: 14th Street from 6th Avenue to north of 8th Avenue
- ◊ Watermain Replacements and Road Fill
- Other (DL10 Emulsion, Lift Station Maintenance, Street and curb painting, etc.)

The Carl Schenn Dry Pond project is well underway. The total cost for the project is estimated to be \$1,617,800 (PST Included) and has been 73% funded by the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program ("ICIP") in the amount of \$1,180,992.
