people in attendance. There were new games and a juggler, with a small concession that sold Lucky Elephant Popcorn (generously donated by the Humboldt Co-op) and other goodies.

Musician Jen Reimer of Montreal presented at the gallery on August 30 about her project, and there were 126 people who joined the performances during the afternoon and evening of August 31. It was 4 people shy of a total sell-out. The suggested donation fee of \$5/person was exceeded with a total donation of \$802. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped during the week with this program!

To the end of August, our programs and services have seen incredible participation with engagement levels of 9,155 people. Thank you to our volunteers who contributed 273 hours of their time in August!

## **Panhandling Bylaw**

Recently there has been an individual that is been observed panhandling in the City of Humboldt. The Mayor has received calls from businesses in our community asking that the City do something to end this activity. A review of different bylaws was conducted along with the rationale of such a bylaw and whether it would be beneficial for Humboldt. The location that the person has been panhandling would be legally allowed in other cities in Saskatchewan. Some municipalities do, however, include in their Bylaws a prohibition from standing as close to the stop sign as it appears that this panhandler locates them self. Panhandling can become a problem if rules are not set out, to adopt a bylaw that is currently being used in other municipalities would ensure that we are proactive and setting the rules are this activity.
