Special Meeting of Council

At a Special Meeting of Council held Monday, March 11th, Council was presented with an Application to temporarily amend a portion of land in the South end of the City to allow the land to be used as a temporary, relocatable work camp. The proposed work camp is comprised of approximately 10 (ten) ATCO trailers to accommodate 20-40 workers for a three year term. Although the construction company is contracted by the City for the Wastewater Treatment Upgrade project, it is their responsibility to establish temporary accommodations for their workers. Six community members came forward and voiced their concerns relating to the proposed location. After much deliberation, Council denied the application due to the requested location being in close proximity to a school and a residential area. Council is not opposed to a camp within City limits, however, they would like to see it in a more appropriate location.

Updates from City Administration

Marketing & Development

Communications has implemented a new dynamic software tool to the City's website that displays Humboldt's demographics and local market data backed with visualizations that are aesthetically attractive. The main data source is Statistics Canada, profiling economic, residential, and dwelling indicators. It is anticipated to make our local market data easily explorable and visually striking.

Communications has also launched the new e-permitting portal on the City's website allowing developers, builders, and homeowners to apply for permits on-line. This new portal provides a number of benefits including 24/7 access to applications, real time updates, improved transparency and increased efficiency.

Community & Leisure Services

Administration met with Sarah McInnis, Executive Director of the Downtown Business Improvement District ("BID") to discuss the boulevards in the downtown area. The CLS Department completed a trial project on the boulevard on Hwy 20 from 4th Ave to 3rd Ave, removing all grass and materials below sidewalk level and replacing them with compacted gravel material. Further discussions will determine if the pilot project resulted in a finished product that is acceptable to all parties.

The months of March and April will be extremely busy within the Uniplex, as events ramp up again this year and the hockey season winds down. Staff will be busy juggling a number of priorities as well as preparing for the upcoming spring outdoor work and a number of projects.

Projects include the new outdoor rink & sports courts, and the new washroom & concession facility in Centennial Park.
