VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

A person is qualified to vote in a municipal election for the offices of Mayor and/or councillor if that person:

- 1. is a Canadian citizen (on Election Day)
- 2. is 18 years of age or older (on Election Day)
- 3. is a Saskatchewan resident and has so resided for at least six months immediately prior to Election Day
- 4. is a resident of the City of Humboldt and has so resided for at least three consecutive months immediately prior to Election day; OR is the owner of assessable land in the City and has done so for at least three consecutive months immediately prior to Election Day.



HOW DO I VOTE?

Regular Polls:

All regular polls will be open on Wednesday, November 13 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Humboldt Uniplex in Jubilee Hall, the Humboldt Legion, and the Westminster United Church.

Advance Polls:

St. Mary's Villa - Friday, November 1 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Jubilee Hall (Humboldt Uniplex) -

Tuesday, November 5 from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m. Wednesday, November 6 from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m. Thursday, November 7 from 1 p.m. to 9p.m.

Caleb Village - Saturday, November 9 from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Electors must provide election officials with proof of identification and residence. A person is not entitled to vote unless he or she:

- completes a Voter Declaration form; and
- proves identity and residence
