Delegations

Geoff Lucas - Humboldt Housing Authority

Geoff Lucas with the Humboldt Housing Authority presented an overview of updates and strategic planning. Council acknowledged and appreciated the report presented by the Humboldt Housing Authority.

Jeffery Pylatiuk & Terry Rorhke - Airport Stakeholders

Jeffery Pylatiuk thanked council for giving them another opportunity to voice their concerns and offering solutions regarding the Humboldt Airport. He also thanked City Administration for meeting with them to explore options to keep the facility publicly owned.

Terry Rorhke touched on the level of activity at the Humboldt Airport and brought additional information on the need for a publicly accessible airport.

Humboldt Pride Week: June 9-15, 2025

Mayor Muench has proclaimed the week of June 9th to 15th as "Humboldt Pride Week" in the City of Humboldt to celebrate diversity.



Pride is a global movement that stands for equality and celebrates the diversity of lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, intersex, queer, questioning, two-spirited and their allies. Pride is a way to honour and respect all people regardless of gender identity or sexual orientation, to recognize our differences and to promote community through education and understanding.





New Business (cont.)

PAMI Lease Agreement:

Council approved the signing of a 10 year lease agreement wth Prairie Agricultural Machinery Insitute (PAMI) located at Parcel A, plan 101813385, for use of land to display the "Iron Triangle" public art piece.

Additional CSO Officer:

Council approved the recommendation from administration that the City create a casual Community Safety Officer (CSO) position, and that administration negotiate with interessed communities in the region for the delivery of Bylaw/CSO service to those municipalities.

Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund Grant:

Council approved the recommendation from administration to compile an application for a Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund (CHIF) grant for the 'City of Humboldt - Northwest and South Housing Infrastructure Expansion Project'

Cemetery Concrete Headstone Ribbons:

Council authorized administration to spend \$15,000 for the installation of new concrete headstone ribbons at the St. Augustine and Public Cemeteries in 2025.

Subdivision Request - Block 93, Lots 1-11

Council approved the request from administration to subdivide parcels CC/DD, Plan 101876452 to create additional residential land in an established neighbourhood. The subdivision is in line with both the Zoning Bylaw and Official Community Plan.

Road Closure:

Council approved the following road closure for the Humboldt Co-op Summer Carnival:

Westwood Drive from Lakewood Drive west to the dead end.

The closure is from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. on June 6th.
