June 2025

Highlights from the Regular Meeting of Council held on Monday, June 23, 2025

Bylaws

Council passed Bylaw 12/2025, a bylaw to amend Bylaw 04/2026 - The Zoning Bylaw. The amendments include wording corrections, reference corrections, and regulation relaxations. The amendments promote new housing units while maintaining the safety and character of the City.

Council passed Bylaw 14/2025, a bylaw to provide for the closing of a municipal street. The bylaw, will allow the city to close the portion of 10th Street that is immediately north and south of 14th Avenue.

New Business

Curling Rink Lease Agreement:

City Council approved the proposed two year lease agreement with the Humboldt Curling Club for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 curling seasons.

Community Safety Officer (CSO) Vehicle:

Council approved the purchase of a 2016 Dodge Charger, fully equipped for the CSO duties, to replace the 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe currently in service.

Discretionary Use - Liquor Store:

A discretionary use application was approved by City Council to operate a Liquor Store at Units 117 & 118, 1919 8th Avenue, legally described as Block A - Plans BL3578 and 67H00360.

Discretionary Use - Multiple Unit Dwelling:

A discretionary use application was approved to operate a Multiple Unit Dwelling at 620 14th Street, legally described as Lot 5 - Block 43 - Plan D182.

Discretionary Use - Shipping Container

Council approved an application for a discretionary use to move in a shipping container at 706 2nd Ave - legally described as Parcel K, Plan 59H05286.

2025 Asphalt Maintenance Quotation Results:

City Council approved the recommendation to award the 2025 Asphalt Maintenance Program to Sask Asphalt Maintenance Ltd.

New Business Cont.

Aerodrome Ownership & Operations update:

At the April 28th Regular Council meeting, City staff was directed to gather additional information regarding the Humboldt Airport to support a decision scheduled for the June Regular Meeting of Council. Since then, two collaborative meetings occurred with regional partners and the airport group to explore long-term sustainability options.

On May 23, 2025: The airport group meeting yielded a proposed chip/seal treatment to extend the runway's life by 10-15 years.

On June 16, 2025: STARS advised that starting June 30th, they will no longer land at the Humboldt hospital due to safety regulations and all landings will occur at the Humboldt airport.

On June 19, 2025: A regional meeting with the RM's of Humboldt and Wolverine explored operational, financial, and governance solutions for the aerodrome.

In light of the developments since the April 28th meeting, it was recommended that all RFP submissions be rejected to allow further development of a regional management framework.

Unfinished Business

Aerodrome Ownership & Operations Request for Proposal Results:

Council defeated the recommendation from the April 28th meeting to sell the Humboldt Aerodrome. All RFP submissions for the Aerodrome ownership and operations have been rejected.


Public Acknowledgments
