### Museum & Gallery:

At the City Council meeting on July 28, 2025, the Council will be considering the following:

The adoption of the South Area Structure Plan. The South Area Structure Plan focuses on development east of Peck Road, west of 101st Street, south of 1st Avenue N. and north of the City Limits.

The City of Humboldt has received a discretionary use application to operate a Construction Trade at 520 9th Street - legally described as Lot 30 - Block 6 - Plan 99H01872. Construction Trades are considered a discretionary use in a C1 Zoning District within the City's Zoning Bylaw No. 04/2016.

**Wastewater Treatment Facility:** Construction Continues with commissioning expected this fall.

**Sewage Lift Stations:** Lift 4 is under construction and Lift 1 construction upgrades will begin this week.
