Highlights from the Regular Meeting of Council held on Monday, August 25, 2025

## PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing was held in regards to a Discretionary Use Application to operate an educational institute at 10225 8th Avenue. No written submissions were received and there was no one in attendance to speak to this matter.

## DELEGATIONS

### Audrey Dore, Ministry of Corrections, Policing & Public Safety

Audrey provided information on the Community Safety Program around the province and here in Humboldt.

Council accepted the information and thanked Audrey for her presentation.

## PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Mayor Muench acknowledged two recently retired members of Council: Michael Behiel served as Mayor from 2020-2024 and as Councillor from 2016-2020, and Kelly Herperger served as Councillor from 2020-2024. Mayor Muench presented them both with service plaques.

Councillor Siermachesky congratulated 12 year-old Alexi Klashinsky who caught and released a 24 pound, 10 ounce Northern Pike to receive the Junior Northern Pike Award in the 2024 Provincial Angling and Henry Kelsey Big Game Awards.

Councillor Siermachesky thanked the Community Safety Officers (CSO's) and the Director of Protective Services for their work in the community with the CSO program.

Councillor Rowe congratulated George Armstrong who was signed with the Saskatoon Hilltops and is joining them for their football season this year.

Councillor Rowe acknowledged the Humboldt Golf Course for hosting the Saskatchewan Amateur Golf Championships in July.

Councillor Rowe congratulated Evan Greff who bought Direct Surplus Liquidation in Humboldt. Evan is a former Humboldt resident who is coming back to raise a family here.

Mayor Muench acknowledged the Humboldt Downtown BID and the Humboldt Chamber for hosting another successful StreetFest event this year.

Mayor Muench thanked everyone that was involved with the Humboldt Broncos Memorial Golf Tournament that was recently held in the community.

## PROCLAMATION

Mayor Muench has proclaimed the week of September 15 through to September 21, 2025, as Rail Safety Week in the City of Humboldt.

CN and Operation Lifesaver have requested City Council adopt this resolution in support of its ongoing efforts to raise awareness, save lives and prevent injuries in communities, including our municipality.

## NEW BUSINESS

### On Demand Scheduling Platform - Transit Services

Council approved the purchase of an on-demand scheduling platform for transit services to Blaise Transit Ltd. The platform will significantly help streamline the processing and scheduling of rides and billing, which will be beneficial as the City intends to expand its transit services.

### Discretionary Use Application - Educational Institute

Council approved the Discretionary Use Application to operate an educational institute at 10225 8th Avenue (Peavey Mart).

### 101st St Lot Draw and Architectural Controls

Council approved the Lot Draw rules and processes for the 101st Street lots and the architectural controls for the lots.

### Natural Gas Contract Authorization

Council gave approval to enter into a natural gas supply contact with a term of up to five years. The City is near the end of the terms of its existing natural gas contracts and will need to enter into a new contract to have pre-determined natural gas costs for the next year or more.

### Additional Fire Department Utility Vehicle and Second CSO/ Bylaw Vehicle

Council approved the purchase of a 1-ton pickup truck for the Fire Department as well as the purchase of an SUV for use as a second Community Safety Officer(CSO/Bylaw) vehicle.

### Humboldt Museum Repairs Tender

Council approved the revised times and material contract from Bxrtton Masonry for the Humboldt Museum repairs project.

## Wastewater Treatment System Construction Update

Construction of the wastewater treatment facility, along with lift stations 1 and 4, continues to advance smoothly and on schedule. The City has received an additional \$2 million in grant funding from the Provincial and Federal Governments through the investing in Canada Infrastructure Program(ICIP).

This contribution significantly reduces the financial burden the City would otherwise assume for this vital infrastructure investment. The improvements represent a major step forward in enhancing our community's environmental sustainability and long-term resilience.
