Rec-Create Humboldt Steering Committee

Council approved the recommendation that administration, in collaboration with the Rec-Create Committee, return to Council within four months with short-term mitigation options, long term infrastructure approach, and a funding and fundraising readiness framework.

Westwood Developments Phase 2 Concept Plan

Council approved the subdivision application from Westwood Developments resulting in the creation of 23 residential allotments, road allowance parcel, and Municipal Reserve subject to a servicing agreement with the City that will provide services and facilities that directly or indirectly serve the subdivision and that the servicing agreement include an overall concept plan for the development.

Public Works Tenders and Quotes:

Council approved the recommendation to award the 2026 Asphalt and Concrete Crushing Project to ABS Excavating Ltd.

Council approved a sole-source purchase of Neptune Mach 10 water meters from Accu-Flo in the amount of \$69,760 + PST.

Council approved the recommendation to award the Tractor tender to KMK Humboldt for a 2024 Massey Ferguson 7S-165 in the amount of \$239,130 and accept the trade-in of the City's 2010 New Holland T7030 for \$55,000 resulting in a net total of \$184,130 plus taxes.

Council approved the recommendation to award the 2026 Paving Program to Ruskowski Enterprises Inc. in the value of \$293,736 plus taxes.
